Fidalgo, the 'drive-to' island, is accessible by bridges from the east and from Whidbey Island to the south. It is also home to the Washington State Ferry terminal, serving the rest of the San Juans and Sidney/Victoria, B.C. Anacortes High School is a comprehensive public high school serving Fidalgo Island residents. Our high school has approximately 775 students and is accredited by the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools. AHS has 41 certified faculty members, three guidance counselors, a prevention specialist, and three administrators assigned to our students. We are on the semester system (two semesters per year) with one (.5) credit earned per class per semester. AHS operates on a 7 period schedule in which students can earn 7.125 credits per year.

Co-curricular activities - Opportunities for participation exist in both athletic and non-athletic venues. Athletic activities include football, cross country, soccer, volleyball, swimming, basketball, wrestling, baseball, track, tennis, golf, fast-pitch, bowling, and cheerleading. Non athletic activities include music, debate, drama, knowledge bowl, and a variety of clubs. AHS is a member of the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association and is classified as a 2A school.

Running Start is a program that provides an opportunity for eligible high school juniors and seniors to enroll in college courses while they are still in high school. Students may receive high school and college credit for completed classes. These courses are identified by a RST designation followed by the course title. To be eligible for Running Start, students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.25 or higher, be at least 16 years of age, and must have successfully completed at least one-half of their high school graduation requirements.

The passing grade is 60%. Students GPA is calculated by unweighted course grades. The highest GPA is ranked #1 and tied ranks are ranked as consecutive clusters. For example, if five (5) students were tied at the top rank, they would all be ranked #1.
